Without regular pruning, an apple tree produces lots of vegetative growth that then turns into fruiting wood. If a tree has too much fruiting wood, it begins to produce too many apples, which weakens the tree and results in inferior—and eventually fewer and less palatable—apples.

Apple seeds are easy to grow at home with the proper preparation, and seedlings are often more vigorous than their grafted nursery counterparts. Give an apple tree seedling 3-4 years and it'll catch up to and pass a potted transplant in size. From there, you have a tree that may bear for centuries.

An apple tree without fruit may not be getting enough sun or water. Poor fruit production can also be caused by over fertilizing. Provide a 2 to 3-inch (5-7.5 cm.) layer of mulch around the tree, but not touching the trunk, for protection and moisture retention.

### Apple Tree Fruiting - Why An Apple Tree Does Not Bear Fruit

In order to grow normal apples, we recommend early cropping. Thinning out young fruit in early summer is beneficial so that the next year's crop is normal. Thinning involves pruning off the smallest fruits on the tree. To put it simply, we recommend leaving one fruit for every 40 to 60 leaves.

### Apple Trees: Everything You Ever Wanted to Know ...

Like many trees, apples have a central leader—a main, upright trunk—that the branches grow out from. If your tree starts to develop a second, competing central leader, remove the competing branch. This helps keep your tree stable and healthy. Also cut out any branches that grow toward the inside of the tree.

### Grow Your Own Apples | Better Homes & Gardens

For an apple tree to grow successfully, it will need a spot where it will receive at least 6-8 hours of sun per day. Seedlings or trees should be planted 15-18 feet apart in a row. For the dwarf variety, plant 4-8 feet apart in a row. If you're growing the dwarf variety, make sure to place next to a fence for support.

### **How to Grow an Apple Tree - Plant Instructions**

In most cases, growing dwarf fruit trees is part of the solution if you want fast-growing trees. These trees reach a height of 10 feet or less, in general, but some can be as small as three feet at full maturity. Despite their smaller size, their fruit is normal-sized, so you aren't ripped off getting tiny apples.

### **How To Grow An Apple Tree From SEED to FRUIT ☐☐! In 3 YEARS!!**

Apple trees are not grown on their own roots. The top of the tree is grafted onto different roots (called a rootstock), and the roots control the size of the tree. Therefore, when you are choosing an apple for a container you must make sure it is grafted onto a container rootstock. Look out for rootstocks called 'M26' for a container.
